# Enablers & Roadblocks Lisa Madden & Francesca Schuler, Team Leads





The Enablers/ Roadblocks Working Group has been focused on developing the most useful and succinct survey for the public safety stakeholders to solicit information on the success and challenges in using data in Emergency Call Centers (ECCs)/PSAPs, Law Enforcement, Fire, and EMS agencies. This survey is expected to be distributed in early

2021; summarized results of the survey will be available.

The survey responses will be used to develop a larger strategy to expand the tools and processes that are successful and mitigate the roadblocks that have hindered the sharing of data. We will then prioritize areas of impact in Focus Groups to

discuss, in more detail, mitigation strategies.

We thank the public safety community in advance, and look forward to a robust participation from our public safety friends in this important effort.
